The report does not include hospitalization data beyond SL/SOLA.

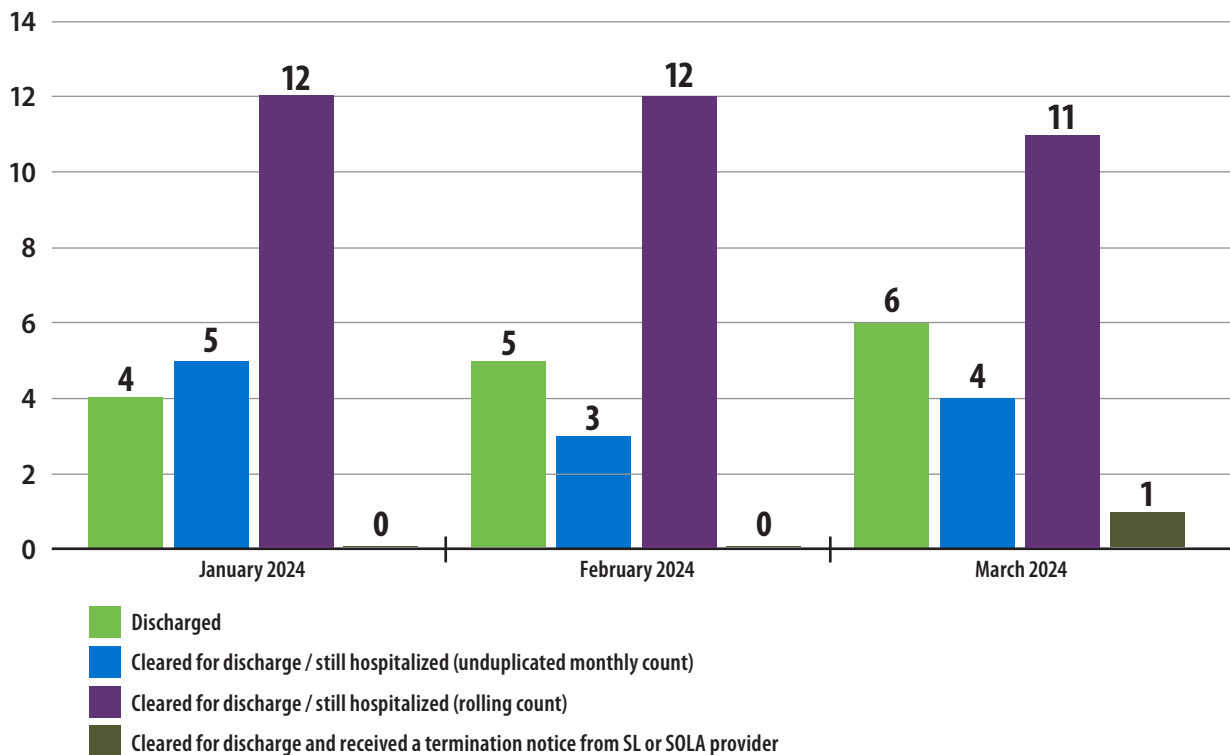
Information in this report reflects data from January – March 2024. It is not a year-to-date roll-up.

**Data provided in this report:**

- Number of clients taken/admitted to a hospital with a medical need and unable to discharge once the medical need was met.
- Average length of stay for clients who remained in the hospital after they were cleared for discharge and their barriers to discharge.
- Number of clients taken/admitted to a hospital without a medical need.
- Location (county) prior to admission to an acute care hospital.
- Type of provider prior to admission.
- Discharge location (county)
- Type of provider at discharge
- Number of SL/SOLA provider termination and reason for termination notice.

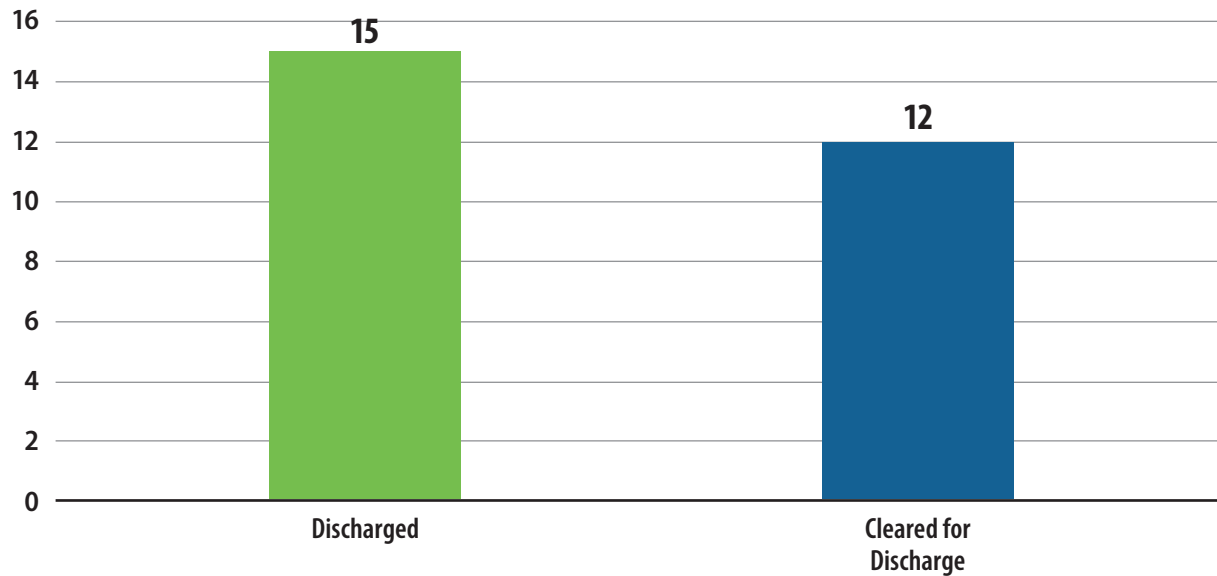
