

Kinship Navigators Can Help



A child needs you, and you've answered the call. Saying "yes" is the easy part – what comes next can feel overwhelming. You are filled with questions: How will I get them the things they need? What legal rights do I have? Where can I find help?

As a grandparent, other relative, or family friend raising children you are a kinship caregiver. In Washington state, there are services for kinship caregivers and their families. **Kinship Navigators** are experts who help kinship caregivers by providing information and support. Kinship navigators can connect you with lots of services in the community. They serve most areas in the state, while Tribal Navigators serve a limited number of tribes.

Kinship Navigators may be able to help you find local services, including:

- Financial Resources
- Emergency Assistance Funds
- Support Groups
- Basic Needs & Clothing
- Summer Respite
- School/Youth Activities
- Legal/Custody Resources
