ALTSA: AFH #2016-006 UPDATE REGARDING EXPECTATIONS FOR E-CIGARETTES & VAPING DEVICES

Dear Adult Family Home Provider:

On August 31, 2015, Residential Care Services (RCS) released a provider letter regarding the use of electronic-cigarettes (e-cigarettes) in long term care (LTC) facilities (AFH # 2015-020). Since the release of the letter, at least one county in Washington has issued a specific ordinance banning the use of e-cigarettes and vaping devices in certain locations. Other counties have indicated an interest in following suit.

Please keep in mind, while Washington State has not banned the use of e-cigarettes or vaping devices in certain locations, adult family home (AFH) regulations do require each home to also follow all local laws and codes (WAC 388-76-10745 (3)). Homes are responsible to know if their local jurisdiction has additional codes or restrictions that apply to the use of e-cigarettes. Homes in counties with these codes will be expected to follow them. If a home is found to be in violation of the code, they may be cited under the AFH regulation that requires compliance with local laws and codes. Please note, while resident room(s) are not considered a public place, the room(s) are considered a part of a place of employment and are included in any restrictions that are specific to places of employment.
