CR-101 FILED TO PROPOSE ADDING & AMENDING SECTIONS
TO CHAPTER 388-76 WAC

Dear Adult Family Home Provider:

The department will be withdrawing CR-101 under WSR #16-19-060, and refile a new CR-101 under [WSR #18-17-088](#) since the stakeholder meetings were placed on hold for over a year. The department is considering adding, repealing, or amending sections to Chapter 388-76 of the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) for Adult Family Home Minimum Licensing Requirements.

The CR-101 document was recently filed with the Office of the Code Reviser. A link to this document can be found on [ALTSA's Information for Adult Family Home Providers web page](#), under "AFH Rule Filings".

The department's purpose in filing the CR-101 is to add, appeal or amend sections to Chapter 388-76 WAC.

- These rules have not been updated in seven or more years and are unclear, ambiguous, and inaccurate.
- These rule changes will create consistent regulations across the Residential Care Services programs.
- The rule making will be limited to the tuberculosis sections and the associated definitions.
