BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROVIDER VISITS

Dear Provider/Superintendent/Administrator:

On March 16, 2020 the governor issued <u>Proclamation 20-16</u>, which amended <u>Proclamation 20-06</u> to prohibit owners, administrators, operators, staff, contractors, and volunteers of a facility, including friends or family to visit a resident. On April 8, 2020 long term care providers were sent a Dear Provider Letter clarifying the prohibition on visitation does not apply to the following:

- End of life situations, including, but not limited to, families and hospice staff
- Visits by attorneys, administrative law judges, advocates or similar persons who represent a resident
- Vendors or volunteers who supply or work in a facility
- Health care teams such as doctors, behavioral health providers, and home health nurses so that care and service needs of residents are met
- Department of Social and Health Services staff, including staff from the Developmental Disabilities Administration and Aging and Long-Term Support Administration

We are aware some behavioral health providers are being prohibited from providing behavioral health services to the residents they serve. This is a reminder that under Proclamation 20-16, behavioral health services are essential and as long as the behavioral health provider passes the facilities health screening, they cannot be stopped from seeing their patients.
