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SAFE START FOR LONG-TERM CARE RECOMMENDATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS: UPDATES AND WEBINAR

Dear Provider / Superintendent / Administrator:

Effective February 1, 2021, revised <u>Safe Start for Long-Term Care Recommendations and Requirements</u> (Safe Start Plans) go into effect. Long-term care settings and providers are required to follow these Safe Start Plans, which are independent of the Governor's January 11, 2021, <u>Healthy Washington – Roadmap to Recovery</u> (roadmap). While the new roadmap effects many people and places in Washington State, long-term care settings and providers must operate under the applicable <u>Safe Start for Long-Term Care Recommendations and Requirements</u>, and under <u>Governor's Proclamation 20-66</u>. However, the Safe Start Plans will refer you to the roadmap where appropriate.

As Washington State communities begin to reopen under the roadmap and expand availability of services and activities, citizens are able to enjoy more time in the community away from home. It is important to recognize that long-term care residents and clients are able to participate in activities away from the home or facility if needed or desired under resident and client rights laws and rules. With residents and clients leaving the home or facility, providers must be mindful of infection control and implement specific procedures to follow when a client or resident returns from an outing. The Safe Start Plans include specific guidance about this process and other infection control measures to help guide you.
