SAFE START FOR LONG-TERM CARE PLANS REPLACED WITH LONG-TERM CARE COVID RESPONSE PLAN

Dear Administrator/Provider/Superintendent:

The Department of Health and the Department of Social and Health Services have replaced the Safe Start for Long-Term Care Recommendations and Requirements Documents with the Long-Term Care (LTC) COVID Response plan. The updated plan is effective as of February 23, 2022.

The plan also includes the following changes:

- Updates visitation recommendations to allow for open visitation in long-term care facilities, unless there is a reasonable clinical or safety cause;
- Provides direction and resources to follow guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Department of Health (DOH), and the local health jurisdiction.
- Nursing homes and ICF/IID must also follow guidance from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS.)
