EMERGENCY RULES AND PROPOSED RULES FILED REGARDING LONG-TERM CARE WORKER TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Dear Administrator/Provider:

On April 6, 2022, the Department of Social and Health Services (department) filed emergency rules under <u>WSR 22-08-110</u> to begin reimplementation of long-term care training requirements that were suspended in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

These emergency rules went into effect April 6, 2022, extending the time long-term care workers must complete training, and set specific dates for completing training based on their date of hire. The rules also grant long-term care workers up to 12 hours of continuing education credit for on-the-job training if they were hired between March 1, 2020 and February 28, 2021. The department also filed a CR-102 under <u>WSR 22-08-112</u> to propose permanent adoption of the emergency rule requirements for long-term care worker training. The public hearing for the proposed rules will be held May 10, 2022 and can be attended virtually.
