STORAGE AND USAGE OF RESIDENT SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT REGARDLESS OF FUNDING SOURCE

Dear Administrators and Providers:

This letter is a reminder that facilities are prohibited from using individually purchase supplies and equipment for anyone other than the person for whom the supplies and equipment were purchased. A facility may use general supplies purchased for the facility under their Medicaid contract as long as the funds are not linked to a specific resident or client.

The facility must provide adequate storage for resident possessions and personal items, including medical supplies and equipment. They should not be comingled with the supplies and equipment purchased by other residents or by the facility, regardless of funding source.

- WAC 182-543-2250 (9) Medical equipment purchased for a client is the client's property.
- <u>WAC 182-543-1000</u> Medical Supplies Health-care related items that are consumable or disposable or cannot withstand repeated use by more than one person.
