PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTERS 388-76, 388-78A AND 388-107 WAC

Dear Provider/Administrator:

The department is proposing adding and amending sections of Chapters 388-76 (Adult family home minimum licensing requirements), 388-78A (Assisted living facility licensing rules), and 388-107 (Licensing requirements for enhanced services facilities) of the Washington Administrative Code (WAC). This is in response to the emergency rules filed during the COVID-19 pandemic. Starting in January, 2022, emergency rules were enacted to suspend the timeline requirements for completing certain resident assessments. For more details please follow this link to the original letter notifying facilities of this change. The goal of this project is to codify the timelines of emergency rules for easier compliance and enforcement.

Recently the Department filed the CR-102, a more formal phase of the rulemaking process, with the Office of the Code Reviser. Follow this link to access the CR-102 (WSR 23-07-076) document and proposed rule language.
