Dear Interested Parties:

We are excited to announce upcoming webinars for continuing community partner engagement to amend and update tuberculosis (TB) rules in long term care facility settings. The COVID-19 public health emergency impacted the progress of the rulemaking. These rules have been identified as outdated, inaccurate, and ambiguous. *We want to hear from you!*

We are looking for community partners that are interested in participating that may be impacted by this rulemaking activity and/or have an interest in TB rules in long term care facilities. This rulemaking activity will affect TB testing, monitoring, and reporting requirements for nursing homes, assisted living facilities, enhanced services facilities, and adult family homes.

The first scheduled webinar, Meeting 1, will address TB regulatory requirements in nursing homes. It will be held to review the information from previous meetings, get up to date with the most recent information, and review previous comments. Subsequent meetings are held for community long-term care facilities. Please see the schedule below for more information.
