Dear Nursing Home Administrators and Interested Parties:

- Shelter residents in their existing setting to the extent possible;
- Ensure individuals in your care were removed from areas threatened by the devastation as necessary; and
- Maintain effective communication with RCS Field Offices during this emergency.

This communication also serves as a reminder to all providers to review components of existing disaster plans, including partnership with first responders, operational continuity, supplies, and recovery.
