ALTSA: NH #2015-007 S&C 15-26: NURSING HOME COMPARE 3.0 FIVE STAR QUALITY RATING SYSTEM EXPANDED AND STRENGTHENED

Dear Nursing Facility/Home Administrator:

Recently, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) issued S&C Memo 15-26-NH regarding changes and improvements to the *Five Star Quality Rating System*.

Effective February 20, 2015 the changes and improvements include:

- Quality Measures (QMs) for nursing homes' use of antipsychotic medication in residents without diagnoses of schizophrenia, Huntington's disease, or Tourette syndrome in the Five Star calculations.
- Raising the threshold for nursing homes to achieve a high rating on all measures publicly reported in the QM dimension on the website.
- Updating expectations for State Survey Agencies to conduct specialized, onsite surveys of a sample of nursing homes across the U.S.
