## In-Person FA/PBSP Plan Writing Training

Supporting individuals with neurodevelopmental and/or mental health conditions requires unique and individualized supports. This two-day information session will focus on how Functional Assessments (FA's) and Positive Behavior Support Plans (PBSP's) can assist individuals toward living successfully in the community. Topics of emphasis will include:

- Regulatory framework(s) guiding the requirements for FA/PBSP's
- Gathering history & conducting a Functional Assessment (FA)
- Turning the FA into an actionable, implementable PBSP
- Person-centered planning / person-centered writing
- Functionally relevant replacement behaviors & teaching/training approaches
- Data collection, analysis, and monitoring
- *And more...*

Participants will also be introduced to DDCS' recently revised, preferred structure of a FA and PBSP (i.e., a new plan structure/format/template option) and will leave with a foundation in how to write person-centered, able-to-be implemented plans with methods to measure their effectiveness.
