Coordinator Summary

It was a great honor for WISE to coordinate the Community Summit: Let's Take Action for the second year in the new location of Wenatchee, WA on June 17th-19th, 2014, sponsored by the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA), several WA counties and the Division of Vocational Rehabiliation (DVR). WISE, DDA and a state wide advisory committee collaborated to develop and plan the second annual Summit. Our goal was to bring together both local and national presenters for individuals who were committed to building inclusive communities. Over 900 individuals attended the Summit with over 50 sessions focusing on three themes: Cutting Edge, Citizen Engagement and Transitions and Transformations. The Summit began with four Kick-Off Sessions. In addition to the main sessions, the Summit included seven Summit Talk open spaced lunch discussions, and a Neighborhood and Technology Expo. On the social scene a Disabiliity Film Festival and Community Market BBQ was provided to attendees.

The Summit's primary emphasis was on building inclusion. The attendees spanned WA State, several states across the country, Canada and New Zealand a specific accounting in the following pages.


The Community Summit created a space for individuals to get connected, learn, reflect on new ideas and experience a new location in Wenatchee, WA. 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Summit Kick Off Session – June 17th, 2014

The Summit had a total of four Kick-Off Sessions to launch the *Community Summit: Let's Take Action* on June 17th, 2014. All Kick-Off sessions were offered as part of registration and the following information highlights content and attendance.

Enhancing School-To-Work Collaborations": 175 Attendees Presenter: Teresa Grossi Ph.D. Center for Community Living and Careers, University of Indiana

This workshop was organizationed by the Community Summit Advisory Committee employment representatives. This interactive and working session with Dr. Teresa Grossi and local WA State providers & partners was intended to develop a "working document" that could be used to clarify roles and responsibilities of all the potential partners during the school-to-work process as well as ensuring clear expectations.

Designing Lives Together: 220 Attendees Presenter: Joe Donofrio, Choicess

This workshop was organized by the Community Summit Advisory Committee family and residential representatives. Balancing State requirement and not loosing focus on the "Whole person". Joe explored how we could establish the intentions to keep the focus on the person while we maintain our systems requirements. As we work towards supporting the whole person we engage in how person centered practices guide our organizations and systems to continue to keep the focus on the individuals and families that we support.

Housing: A Home in the Community for Everyone: 68 Attendees Presenter Panel: George Braddock, Joe Wykowski, Jan Navarre and Pam Blanton

This workshop was organized by the Community Summit Advisory Committee family and residential representatives. This session focused on affordable housing, accessible to our community, and meets our unique desires for a home that works for us. This kick off session discussed national trends for financing and developing affordable housing; housing resources unique to Washington; and finding homes and making improvements that provide the right living environment for each person.


Utilizing Lean Philosophy and Tools to Promote Quality Outcomes: 95 attended Presenter: Teri Johnson



Community Summit in the News

WENATCHEE — What the heck were all those people doing Tuesday at Pybus Public Market dancing and eating barbecue? The revelers, about 550 of them, were part of the Community Summit convention put on annually by the state Developmental Disabilities Administration. Their party was the biggest event hosted at the market this year. The convention ended at noon Thursday. Event organizer Monica McDaniel said total group numbers more than 900 people from around the state and the world, including Canada, New Zealand and Europe, to hear keynote speakers and learn about their industry's best practices.

Participants included professionals who provide services to families and individuals with developmental disabilities, along with employers and service recipients. This was their first time in Wenatchee. And they like it. "We wanted this feel," McDaniel said of the market with its diverse vendors and sense of community gathering place. "We wanted for our people to come together and be a community." As she spoke, participants collected tickets at Pybus' south entrance for barbecued chicken and pulled pork sponsored by market staple Mike's Meats.

They filled the market's conference room and spilled out onto a narrow deck jam-packed with tables, around the market's southeast corner.

County music and classical rock played over a speaker system for an evening dance. McDaniel said they'd held the 20-year event in Ellensburg, but had outgrown the space. A combination of good customer service, the Wenatchee Convention Center, nearby businesses, lots of hotel rooms, and the Pybus market sold them on Wenatchee. She said they'd be back next year.


