

## Minimum Wage & Supplemental Security Income Benefits

## **Washington State Minimum Wage**

Date	Washington state	Seattle	SeaTac	Tacoma
2018	\$11.50	\$11.50-\$15.45*	\$15.64	\$12
2019	\$12.00	\$12.00-TBD**	**	**
2020	\$13.50	\$13.50-TBD**	**	**

**Fact:** In the state of Washington, an individual receiving **SSI** benefits can earn at least **\$33,120** per year and still stay connected to SSI and Medicaid. Eligibility to SSI and Medicaid will continue even if the SSI check is reduced to zero dollars!

<sup>\*\*</sup>adjusted annually for inflation



The annual amount that can be earned and stay connected to SSI and Medicaid. More can possibly be earned depending on the individuals's circumstances.

**Fact:** \$750 is the maximum monthly SSI payment for 2018.

Fact: For every \$2 that an individual earns, the SSI check will be reduced by about \$1. The 2 for 1 reduction ensures that <u>a</u> worker will always have more monthly income than on SSI alone.

This information only applies to individuals receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI). This information does NOT apply to individuals who are receiving Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI).
