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General Assistance provides cash assistance to adults who cannot work and do not have dependent children. This section describes the General Assistance program separated into three main categories:

- 1. General Assistance-Unemployable (GA-U). The GA-U program is designed for those who are not employable.
- 2. General Assistance-Expedited Medicaid (GA-X). The GA-X program supports clients with pending applications for SSI, the federal Supplemental Security Income.
- 3. **General Assistance-Other.** Other General Assistance programs include Aged (GA-A), Blind (GA-B), Disabled (GA-D), Institutionalized (GA-I), and Regular (GA-R).

Highlights:

- The average monthly Combined General Assistance caseload increased 6.7% in SFY 2008 (31,172 cases) from SFY 2007 (29,220 cases).
- The average payment per case in SFY 2008 was \$306.87, compared to \$307.78 in SFY 2007.
- The average monthly GA-U Only caseload increased 5.1% in SFY 2008 (16,042 cases), from SFY 2007 (15,265 cases).
- The average monthly GA-X Only caseload increased 5.5% in SFY 2008 (11,842 cases), from SFY 2007 (11,224 cases).
- The average monthly GA-Other caseload increased 20.4% in SFY 2008 (3,288 cases), from SFY 2007 (2,731 cases).
- In June 2008, most GA-U Only recipients were male (59.9%), and most recipients were white (66.7%). The median age for GA-U only recipients was 44 years.
- In June 2008, most GA-X Only recipients were male (54.8%), and most recipients were white (71.4%). The median age for GA-X only recipients was 44 years.
- In June 2008, most GA-Other recipients were female (61.6%) and most recipients were over 65 years old (72.2%). The median age for GA-Other recipients was 70 years old.




