

The Statutes for these States do not reflect Court decisions:
Without a specific State Statute, Courts may give an opinion or decision that says Child Support should be paid beyond age 18 giving a "common law", or "case law" interpretation.

Currently, 15 States statutorily forbid "post-secondary education" child support. They are:
