<u>Clarifying Information</u> and <u>Worker Responsibilities</u>

Clarifying Information - WAC 388-478-0060 WAC 388-478-0060

- 1. The federal government sets the income and resources standards. The income standards are updated October 1st each year based on the federal poverty level in effect at the time.
- 2. The gross income standard is based on 130% of the federal poverty level.
- 3. The net income standard is based on 100% of the federal poverty level.
- 4. These standards are based on the poverty level for the 48 contiguous states. It excludes Alaska and Hawaii because of the higher cost of living in those states.

Worker Responsibilities -WAC 388-478-0060 WAC 388-478-0060

- 1. If the AU's income is over the standards for their AU size, deny or terminate assistance. Remember to apply any appropriate exceptions allowed under Basic Food rules.
- 2. See <u>WAC 388-450-0245</u> when an increase in income causes the AU to be ineligible for one month.

165 Percent Standard for Clients Recipients Who Are Both Elderly and Disabled

- 1. A <u>client recipient</u> who is both elderly and disabled and can't cook their own meals may be in a separate AU **only** if the other people who would normally be in the AU (not counting the person's spouse) have combined income at or under the 165% standard.
- 2. The <u>client's recipient's spouse</u> must always be in the AU if they live with the client. See <u>ASSISTANCE UNITS - Basic Food.</u>
