What activities are these incarcerated individuals required to do when accepted in the program?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Mental health or chemical dependency treatment ○ Parenting classes, or parenting activities ○ Work or vocational training ○ Life Skills ○ Other similar productive activities that are permitted 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Same as FOSA, except offender must coordinate with DOC to be released from their home for scheduled activities

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What CSD programs are these incarcerated individuals potentially eligible for?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ TANF – if child in home or expected to return home in 180 days ○ ABD –if parent is disabled and otherwise ineligible for TANF ○ HEN – if parent is incapacitated and otherwise ineligible for TANF ○ Basic Food ○ WCCC ○ Medicaid 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Same as FOSA
What is CSD responsible for when offenders are accepted in the program?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Collaborate with DOC to incorporate required activities in WorkFirst IRP or ABD Case Plan ○ Collaborate with DCYF, if appropriate ○ Collaborate with Tribes, if appropriate 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Same as FOSA
