

Rev WFHB 3.4.3 When are case staffings mandatory?

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Case staffings are mandatory for participants who haven't participated in WorkFirst activities, without good cause, before entering sanction status.

The goal of the NCS Case Staffing is to re-engage the participant into appropriate WorkFirst activities.

A good cause/non-compliance Sanction (NCS) case staffing requires the assigned worker to invite ~~two at least one~~ other relevant ~~professionals~~ professional such as ~~the WFPS/WFSSS~~ another [WorkFirst staff member](#), Public Health Nurse, Chemical Dependency Professional, etc. The ~~there must be a minimum of two professionals at the staffing, the Case Manager worker (WFPS or WFSSS)~~ assigned to the case counts as one professional.

It is extremely important to invite a Child Welfare Programs (CWP) Social Service Specialist if CWP is working with the individual.
