#### **Temporary Credential Reinstatement**

- LTC filed emergency rule to temporarily reinstate all credentials
- Applies to all those whose credentials set to expire between 4/6/19 and 7/28/19
- They remain credentialed through 7/29/19
- Retesting is required for new certification/authorization
  - Online search tool shows how many interpreters are currently credentialed (excluding the temporary credential): 3700 current credentials

#### **Aftermath**

- How to determine impact of 4/6/19 expirations?
- LTC working on a process to determine how many interpreters have re-tested already and how many will do so in the future from our records – but no easily available means at this time
- Would like to collect information from community partners as well

#### **Renewed Certifications/Authorizations**

- Renewed certificates and authorization letters will be mailed out between April 22 and May 6, 2019.
- Renewed credentials will keep the previous certification/authorization number except for old certificate numbers (with 6 digits and no letters) which have been converted to new numbers in line with the new numbering system (old 6 digit numbers remain on the records for reference)

 As always, new certificates are mailed out the first or second week of the month following certification/authorization. New certifications/authorizations will have new numbers.

### **Expand Testing through June**

- L&I funding additional testing March through June
- About 650 additional tests in the 4 months
- In April, LTC limited registration to screened languages for the first two weeks of April –
   Seattle filled up almost completely in those 2 weeks, Olympia about 20%; and Yakima less than 10%
- We may occasionally do this in future but due to the high volume of certified language candidates seeking to re-test perhaps not until after June

#### **LTC Communication Plan**

- Our goal is to have current e-mail contact information to send updates to people in the future.
- Interpreters and translators should still be in the habit of checking the LTC website regularly to stay informed.

  always include your certification number(s) so we can find the records to update.

#### **Revocation Appeal**

- In late December 2018, LTC revoked credentials after reviewing application for revocation submitted by L&I
- Interpreter appealed
- LTC has requested AG representation in this appeal and future appeals where the appellant is represented by counsel
- Will share an update after the conclusion of the appeal

### **Discussion/Questions**

- Fill rates at this point HCA data dashboard shows Russian fill rates over 90%
  - LTC will base initial limiting (if needed) on data from June 1, 2018 through July 1, 2019

 It will take several months for data to mature and also for LTC to develop a method to limit languages and allow exceptions required by RCW
