April 6, 2019 Credential Expirations

- Concern over the coming drop off of available certified/authorized interpreters
- Still not sure what the numbers will be many will be expiring have heard anywhere from 15% to 50% of practicing interpreters may expire
- Larger impact on certain languages/regions
- Many whose credentials will expire have already re-tested and become re-certified
- Also new interpreters continue to test and become certified/authorized
- Many will renew on 4/6/19
- Can search and find those who have submitted all of the requirements using the CE tracking tool
 - o 16 general credits
 - o 4 years of ethics listed as a date
 - Background Check Attestation Form listed as a date
 - Signed Code of Conduct listed as a date
- LTC can't issue the renewed certificates until after the renewal date because the must be printed out of the database

- LTC will print and mail out new certificates and authorization letters as quickly as possible
- Hiring entities should use the tracking tool to find those who are renewed/fully certified or authorized

Temporary Credential Reinstatement

- LTC will be filing for an emergency rule/WAC
- Due to the upcoming expiration on 4/6/19 and its impact on interpreter availability LTC proposing to issue a one-time, temporary credential reinstatement
- Who? All those whose credentials will expire between 4/6/19 and 6/29/19 (expiration of the temporary reinstatement) may request this letter
- How Long? Through 6/30/19
- What will it do?
 - o Allow them to continue working while they retest
 - Does not allow them to make up the missing renewal requirements (Continuing education credits/signed code/background check attestation form)
- How? Interpreters must fill out a request form
 - Available on LTC website
 - o Fill out and email to LTC
- LTC will begin issuing letters in early March
- Letter will be the only way for hiring entities to determine if this has been granted not able to search the online tool for these names – but can confirm with LTC via email requests
- Final details will go out in a letter to all of you members of LTCAC as well as language agencies, and stake holders
- Some members worry that this will reward those interpreters who have not complied with WAC requirements, others feel the extra time to re-test will be useful for the many who need to retest and to mitigate the impact on LEP community

Expand Testing

- Plan to expand testing for the next few months with the financial support of L&I
- Entering an inter-agency agreement DSHS/L&I
- LTC will receive funds for tests beyond what DSHS/SESA budget allows
- LTC will increase test spots starting in March through June as follows
 - Seattle
 - adding one extra day with 2 proctors and another extra day with one proctor approx. 36 oral test spots
 - In addition to regular testing approx. (84 oral spots and 45 written)
 - Olympia
 - Addingfull days of 2 proctors approx. 48 oral spots
 - In addition to regular testing (between 72-84 oral tests and 45-90 written)
 - Yakima
 - Adding two oral dates with one proctor (approx. 24 oral spots)

- In addition to regular testing of approx. 36 oral spots and 40 written
- Spokane
 - No additional testing but March/June will both offer 3 days of testing one proctor as scheduled
 - This is the regularly scheduled testing 30 oral tests and 20 written each of those months

Revocation/Decertification Appeal

- Recent revocation request from L&I LTC revoked at the end of December
- Appeal filed with OAH
- Awaiting notice of prehearing date will be in a few weeks and hearing will be scheduled within a month or so
