

How do I get a good job?

Going to school for one year can make a big difference. A one year certificate can get you a job that pays enough to take care of your family.

Education programs are available to help you get the job you want. If you receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), you can attend classes at no cost that will help you get a job. Programs that lead to a certificate, and a job, may be included in your Individual Responsibility Plan (IRP). Local colleges will help you apply for financial aid you may need for other programs.

Don't have a high school diploma or general equivalency yet? We can help, and it's the first step towards getting the job that will take care of your family.

How do I get paid more?

Continue your education while you are working to raise your income. Getting the education you need to be self sufficient is the first step in reaching your goals.

Cathy hadn't worked in two years and hadn't been to school in a decade. As a mom of two kids she was anxious about returning to school, but knew it was the only way she would get better than a minimum wage job.

Cathy completed a Business Management Certificate at her local community college in one year while receiving a TANF grant to help support her family.

Now Cathy is working as an insurance agent. She earns enough money to support her family without TANF.

Cathy is continuing her education while she works. The classes Cathy took for her certificate can be applied to her Business Administration degree completion.
