WHO CAN PARTICIPATE

- ▶ Students age 16-21
(as young as 14 if on a transition IEP)
- ▶ Students receiving special education on an IEP
- ▶ Students receiving accommodations on a 504 plan
- ▶ Students who have a medically documented disability

WHAT TO KNOW

- ▶ Services delivered based on need. Aligns with student IEP, High School and Beyond Plan vocational goals
- ▶ Services coordinated in collaboration with local school districts

WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED

JOB EXPLORATION

Students explore the world of work and learn more about their interests, abilities and future goals

SELF-ADVOCACY

Students develop the skills necessary to flourish in work and everyday life

WORK-BASED LEARNING

Students have the opportunity to gain work experience prior to graduation

WORKPLACE READINESS TRAINING

Students learn what it takes to work in the real world, including job-related independent living skills

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION COUNSELING

Students receive guidance on how to gain education and/or technical training past high school
