- Build skills for other career opportunities in long-term care and elsewhere in the health care industry.
- Earn greater than minimum wage with employment benefits.

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Requirements

- Must be 18 years old
- Pass background checks
- Complete 75 hours of training within 120 days of hire date – training is free for some workers
- Pass a knowledge and performance exam for certification through the Department of Health
- Complete 12 hours of continuing education annually once certified

Home care aide careers

Those who become a partner in person-centered caregiving will receive the benefits and rewards of serving others as their career grows.

Choice of work environment

- **Assisted living facility:** a community setting where staff is responsible for the safety and well-being of residents. Housing, meals, laundry, supervision, and varying levels of assistance with care are provided. The home can have seven or more residents and is licensed by the state.
- **Adult family home:** a private home in a residential neighborhood where staff provide personal care services for residents. It is a welcoming and intimate environment accommodating two to six residents. Adult family homes are licensed by the state.
- **Client home:** assistance provided to an individual in their own home. This model allows the client to maintain a healthy, safe, and enriching lifestyle without having to relocate. Home care aides can work as individual providers who are registered through the Home Care Referral Registry or through a home care agency.
