## **DSHS Facility Instructor** — Qualification Requirements

## **All instructors must:**

- 1. Be 21 years of age.
- 2. Have **not** had a professional health care or social services license or certification revoked in Washington state.
- 3. **In addition to the general qualifications listed below**, an instructor must meet the following qualifications for DSHS approval:
