Civil Transitions Program



PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Responsibilities were created for Aging and Long-Term Support Administration (ALTSA) relating to individuals deemed by the court not competent to stand trial and not restorable due to a diagnosis of dementia, traumatic brain injury (TBI), or an intellectual or developmental disability (IDD).

The Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) refers individuals to ALTSA's Home and Community Services (HCS) to determine eligibility and services. Individuals may have an assigned regional Forensic Navigator through BHA to coordinate with the HCS Case Manager.

When does this program begin?

Senate Bill 5440 provided the framework for the program. Program services became effective on December 1, 2023.

What services are offered?

Depending on eligibility, the program may offer personal care services or immediate housing, among others.


ELIGIBILITY AND SERVICES

* Must meet Nursing Facility Level of

Care. These services align within the

Community First Choice Program (CFC)

Referred individuals will be assessed for functional and financial eligibility to determine the conditional service package.



Services are offered to assist with a safe transition back to

the community. All services offered by HCS are voluntary and

provided in collaboration with the individual.

DURATION OF SERVICES

- Services will be authorized for 6 months.
- The 6-month timeframe will always start on the first day of service authorization.
- Financial and functional eligibility will be reviewed at 90 days for continued need of services.

Exception: For those at risk of homelessness, housing services will be reviewed at 6 months with the ability to re-authorize for 24 months.

CASE MANAGEMENT

- Individuals will be case-managed by designated regional HCS staff for the duration of their coverage.
- Individuals will not be transferred to the Area Agencies on Aging (AAA).

HOUSING SUPPORTS

Conditionally-eligible individuals who are, or at risk of becoming homeless may receive supportive housing services to meet this immediate need.
