

Developmental Disabilities Community Services Individual and Family Services Waiver

Overview

The Individual and Family Services waiver is one of DSHS Developmental Disabilities Community Services five federal Home and Community Based Services waivers. This waiver offers services and support to up to 8,000 participants who live at home with a family member.

Eligibility

Individuals who are:

- Are a client of the Developmental Disabilities Community Services.
- Meet disability criteria established in the Social Security Act.
- Live with their family.
- Meet Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities level of care criteria.
- Have a DDCS assessment and Person-Centered Service Plan that describe how the participant's health, safety, and habilitation needs will be met in the community.
- Have agreed to accept home and community-based services as an alternative to institutional services.

Budget

Participants use an annual budget, based on an assessment, to purchase services. Annual budget allocations are:

- \$1,560
- \$2,340
- \$3,120
- \$4,680

Stabilization services are paid for outside of the annual budget allocations. In fiscal year 2024, we served 6,270 clients on the IFS waiver at an average cost of \$126 per month.

Waivers are limited to the average cost of an Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities for any combination of services necessary to meet the assessed client need. We cannot deny services to people on the waiver due to lack of funding, so waiver costs are carefully monitored.



Authority

Federal funding under section 1915c of the Social Security Act, Home and Community Based Services Waivers and state funding.
