Train quickly – Training and related materials may be offered in several languages and may be completed after you start working.

How to Become a Certified Home Care Aide

- Check with employers in your area Some may hire and then pay for training and certification.
- Complete 75 hours of training.
- Take knowledge and skills exams, which are offered in many languages.
- Pass the exam and get your certification through the Department of Health!

Work Environment

Individual's Home – A caregiver works in a private home with one resident and may work flexible hours.

Adult Family Home – A caregiver works in a licensed private home setting with one to eight residents and may work consistent hours.

Assisted Living Facility – A caregiver works in a large licensed community residential setting with several residents and may work consistent hours.

Career Advancement Opportunities

A paid caregiving job may lead to other careers in the health care field with additional training and experience.
