About this Report

This report provides local information for Washington counties to monitor the behavioral health treatment needs and outcomes of individuals receiving Medicaid. For each county and the state as a whole, we present indicators for four population groups: 1) disabled adults and children on Medicaid, 2) non-disabled classic Medicaid adults, 3) non-disabled Medicaid expansion adults, and 4) non-disabled children and youth on Medicaid or SCHIP. Measures include rates of behavioral health treatment need (mental health, substance use disorder, co-occurring disorder, psychotropic polypharmacy) and outcomes often associated with the treatment need: involvement in the criminal justice system, emergency department utilization, and homelessness. The rates are presented for State Fiscal Years (SFY) 2010 through 2016 by age, gender, race or ethnicity, and geographically. Rates mapped by county identify areas of the state with higher and lower needs; the maps provide a quick way to compare each county to its neighbors and other counties.

Population

To account for changes associated with the implementation of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), four groups are identified:

DISABLED-MEDICAID: Children and adults ages 0 to 64 years federally qualified under full-scope Title XIX (Medicaid) who meet disability criteria.

CLASSIC ADULT-MEDICAID: Non-disabled adults ages 18 to 64 years federally qualified under full-scope Title XIX (Medicaid) who are pregnant women or caretakers/relatives.

EXPANSION ADULT-MEDICAID: Non-disabled adults ages 19 to 64 years federally qualified under the Affordable Care Act (expanded Medicaid).

CHILD-MEDICAID: Non-disabled children ages 0 to 17 years federally qualified under full-scope Title XIX (Medicaid) and Title XXI (CHIP).

Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.




Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Any Behavioral Health Tx Need








Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Any Behavioral Health Tx Need




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Any Behavioral Health Tx Need

Among Medicaid-Children, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Children with Any Behavioral Health Tx Need





Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.

Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Mental Illness Tx Need








Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Mental Illness Tx Need







Among Medicaid-Expansion Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Mental Illness Tx Need








Among Medicaid-Children, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Children with Mental Illness Tx Need





Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.







Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Substance Use Disorder Tx Need





Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Substance Use Disorder Tx Need







Among Medicaid-Expansion Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Substance Use Disorder Tx Need







Among Medicaid-Children, by County




Percent of Medicaid Children with Substance Use Disorder Tx Need





Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.







Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Co-Occurring Disorder Tx Need







Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Co-Occurring Disorder Tx Need







Among Medicaid-Expansion Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Co-Occurring Disorder Tx Need







Among Medicaid-Children, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Children with Co-Occurring Disorder Tx Need





Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.







Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Criminal Justice Involvement







Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Criminal Justice Involvement







Among Medicaid-Expansion Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Criminal Justice Involvement







Among Medicaid-Children, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Children with Criminal Justice Involvement





Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.

Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Psychotropic Polypharmacy








Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Psychotropic Polypharmacy







Among Medicaid-Expansion Adults, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Psychotropic Polypharmacy







Among Medicaid-Children, by County




Percent of Medicaid-Children with Psychotropic Polypharmacy





Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.





Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County




Rate of ED Use per 1000 coverage months for Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults




Rate of ED Use per 1000 coverage months for Medicaid-Classic Adults




Rate of ED Use per 1000 coverage months for Medicaid-Expansion Adults




Rate of ED Use per 1000 coverage months for Medicaid-Children



Why are measures produced separately by major Medicaid coverage groups? Different coverage groups have significantly different characteristics and experiences. Counties vary in the share of their caseloads comprised of different coverage groups. For example, Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has significantly changed the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, and the share of adult Medicaid coverage comprised of newly covered adults varies across counties. Reviewing information by coverage group supports more valid comparisons of client experiences across counties.

Impact of Medicaid Expansion on interpretation of trends. Medicaid Expansion has had complex effects on the composition of the adult Medicaid caseload, beyond simply expanding coverage to new populations. For example, the "classic non-disabled adult" coverage group experienced a caseload increase related to changes in eligibility rules that tended to bring healthier new enrollees into this preexisting coverage group. Also, some preexisting high-risk coverage groups (Presumptive SSI, Disability Lifeline and ADATSA coverage groups) transitioned into New Adult coverage upon implementation of the ACA, creating an initial New Adult population in 2014 with a higher prevalence of physical and behavioral health risk factors, compared to the composition of the New Adult population in 2015 and future years. As a result, caution should be used in interpreting trends – even within major coverage groups – in particular over the 2013 to 2015 time period.






Among Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults, by County


Percent of Medicaid-Disabled Youth and Adults with Homelessness


Among Medicaid-Classic Adults, by County


Percent of Medicaid-Classic Adults with Homelessness




Percent of Medicaid-Expansion Adults with Homelessness




Among Medicaid-Children, by County


Percent of Medicaid-Children with Homelessness

TECHNICAL NOTES

Medicaid Population Definitions and Limitations

The population used for this report consists of children, youth, and adults, ages 0-64, who had at least one month of medical coverage under Title XIX of Medicaid during the state fiscal year (SFY). Two aspects of the population are worth noting.

- 1) Limitations on Medicare Data Use: Those ages 65 and older were excluded from the analysis because they are primarily on Medicare and Medicare data was unavailable for purposes of this analytical project. It was thus impossible to provide an accurate description of the 65 and older population.
- 2) ACA Expansion: The time series element of this analytical product bridges the implementation of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), which expanded Medicaid. With ACA expansion beginning in January 2014, the Medicaid population increased substantially. As a result, four Medicaid populations should be analyzed separately to avoid incorrect inferences. For example, the expanded Medicaid population has lower morbidity rates than the traditional Medicaid population. If these two groups were combined, a drop in morbidity would be seen that is actually the result of changes in the populations served rather than changes in the programs. To avoid this issue the current analysis breaks the Medicaid population into the following four analytical groups.

DISABLED-MEDICAID: Full-scope Title XIX (Medicaid) federally qualified individuals who meet disability criteria under one of the following programs: Categorically Needy Blind/Disabled, Categorically Needy Health Care for Workers with Disabilities (HWD), Categorically Needy Breast & Cervical Cancer Treatment Program, Medically Needy Blind/Disabled.

CLASSIC ADULT-MEDICAID: Full-scope Title XIX (Medicaid) federally qualified adult Pregnant Women (with Modified Adjusted Gross Income [MAGI] up to 193% of the federal poverty level [FPL]) and adult Caretaker/Relatives, age 18 and over.

EXPANSION ADULT-MEDICAID: Non-disabled federally qualified adults between ages 19-64 with Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) less than 138% of the federal poverty level (FPL) and who would not qualify for 'Classic' Adult Medicaid coverage. Includes adults who aged out of Foster Care, until they turn 26.

CHILD-MEDICAID: Full-scope Title XIX (Medicaid, with Modified Adjusted Gross Income [MAGI] up to 205% of the federal poverty level [FPL]), and Title XXI (CHIP, with Modified Adjusted Gross Income [MAGI] up to 305% of the federal poverty level [FPL]) for federally qualified non-disabled children under age 18.

Metric Definition Descriptions

Mental Illness Treatment Need: In the current or past State Fiscal Year (SFY), any mental health diagnosis, prescription or service recorded in administrative data. The following diagnostic categories are included: Psychotic, Bipolar, Depressive, Anxiety, Adjustment, and ADHD/Conduct/Impulse disorders. The following medication classes are included: Antipsychotic, Antimania, Antidepressant, Antianxiety, and ADHD. Mental health services include Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery's contracted community inpatient or outpatient services, state hospital or children's long-term inpatient (CLIP) services, tribal mental health services, and Children's Administration Behavioral Rehabilitation Services (BRS). Medical claim indicators are based on the International Classification of Diseases, version 9 and 10 (ICD-9 or ICD-10). The source data are drawn from the ProviderOne Operational Data Store (P1 ODS) and Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery.

Substance Use Disorder Treatment Need (SUD Tx Need): In the current or past SFY, at least one substance-related diagnosis, procedure, prescription, treatment, or substance use related arrest. Data for this measure are derived from a combination of: 1) Fee-for-service paid claims and accepted managed care encounters in the ProviderOne Operational Data Store (P1 ODS), 2) Treatment and Report Generation Tool (TARGET) encounters, and 3) Alcohol or other drug (AOD) related arrest charges from the Washington State Patrol (WSP). Medical claim indicators are based on the International Classification of Diseases, version 9 and 10 (ICD-9 or ICD-10). TARGET indicators are based on records of detox and treatment for substance use disorders. Arrest indicators are based on arrests for SUD related offenses.

Any Behavioral Health Treatment Need (BH Tx Need): Presence of mental illness treatment need or a substance use disorder treatment need during the current or prior SFY. For greater detail on how each component is measured please see the definitions of Mental Illness Treatment Need and Substance Use Disorder above.

Co-occurring Disorder Treatment Need (COD Tx Need): Presence of both a mental health treatment need and a substance use disorder treatment need during the SFY or prior SFY. For greater detail on how each component is measured please see the definitions of Mental Illness Treatment Need and Substance Use Disorder above.

Criminal Justice Involvement: The presence of either (1) any arrest for a felony or gross misdemeanor during the SFY, as recorded in the Washington State Patrol database or, (2) activity recorded in the Washington State Institute for Public Policy (WSIPP) recidivism database that indicates a disposition associated with criminal activity (conviction, detention, JRA referral, deferral, or diversion).

Psychotropic Polypharmacy: The presence of four or more psychotropic medication prescriptions in the SFY, as indicated from claims data for filled prescriptions drawn from the Provider One Operational Data Store (P1 ODS). In the present analysis psychotropic medication includes Antipsychotics, Antimania medications, Antidepressants, Antianxiety medications, and ADHD medications.

Emergency Department Utilization (ED Use): The emergency department use rate is defined as the number of Emergency Department visits in SFY per 1,000 member-months. Member-months are months in which individuals had coverage under Medicaid. The Medicaid coverage month criteria is essential for this measure since emergency department visits are pulled from Medicaid claims data and do not include claims from non-Medicaid sources. Not using the Medicaid coverage month concept would result in artificially deflating the ED Use rates. Data for this measure are derived from a combination of fee-for-service paid claims and accepted managed care encounters in the ProviderOne Operational Data Store (P1 ODS).

Homelessness: Homelessness is defined as experiencing at least one episode of being homeless without housing (i.e., unable to stay with a friend or relative), a stay in an Emergency Housing Shelter, or a stay in a Battered Spouse Shelter in the SFY. The data for the homeless measure are drawn from the Washington State Automated Client Eligibility System (ACES).

Population by Race-Ethnicity

Race and ethnicity data is based on DSHS clients' self report. Clients can report more than one race. The current set of reporting categories are Non-Hispanic White (one race only), Any Minority, American Indian or Alaska Native, Black or African-American, Asian, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and Hispanic. Since a person can be a member of more than one minority group, the percentages for individual racial categories will sum to more than the percent shown for "Any Minority." "White Only" and "Any Minority" sum to 100 percent.

Map Classification

The 2014 rate maps were created using the Jenks Optimization method which works to minimize variance within classes and maximize variance between classes (also known as "Natural Breaks" or "Goodness of Variance Fit"). Typically, 5 classes or fewer are recommended.


